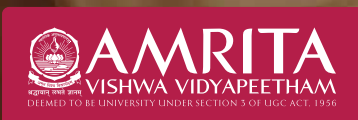

Guidelines for Paper Submission

The selection of papers for presentation will be confirmed after approval from the review committee. The paper must be an original research work. The paper must include abstract, purpose, major results, implications, key references, and keywords. The author(s) should clearly mention under which area the paper may be included. They should adhere to the following:

Title Page: Title, Author(s), Affiliation(s), Contact Details

Contributions should be between 5000 and 6000 words including Abstract, Notes, References and Author's Note.

Abstract and Keywords

The abstract should not exceed 200 words and should include up to 6 keywords.

Publication

1. After a thorough review, selected papers will be published in Scopus-indexed conference proceedings by Bloomsbury.
2. Edited Volume by Peter Lang will be sent for Scopus indexing by the publisher

*APC will be communicated to the authors of the selected papers.
