Revised norms of disciplinary action with respect to the nature of examination malpractices Implemented with effect from the Odd Semester of the Academic Year 2025-2026

S. No.	Nature of Malpractice	Disciplinary Action
		Periodical / Midterm / Continuous Assessment / End-Semester/ Supplementary
1	Writing on the desk by the candidate relevant to the examination, if proven	Zero marks in the examination concerned
2	The candidate involved in verbal or written communication with other candidates	
3	The candidate possessing any incriminating material(s) (whether used it or not). For example: (a) written or printed materials; (b) bits of papers containing written information, (c) writings on scale, calculator, handbooks, hall ticket, dress, handkerchief, or any part of the body.	‘F’ grade in the subject concerned
4	The candidate (a) possessing the question paper of another candidate with additional writing on it (b) passing the question paper to another candidate with additional writing on it (c) possessing the answer script of another candidate (d) passing the answer script to another candidate (e) passing the incriminating materials to another candidate (f) copying from adjacent candidate (g) facilitating other candidates to copy from his/her answer script (h) taking out answer script(used/unused) from the examination hall (i) destroying the evidence related to alleged irregularity	
5	The candidate possessing (a) mobile phones (b) smart watches (c) programmable calculators (d) Bluetooth devices, or any electronic communication device that can transmit data/messages (whether used or not)	
6	Misbehaviour in the examination hall: The candidate is found to be involved in (a) creating disturbances (b) disobeying invigilator’s instructions (c) threatening examination/ invigilation officials, or any unruly conduct	

7	Forgery in any part of the record/document submitted by the candidate	
8	The candidate is found to have committed manipulation in computer-based examinations, including but not limited to: (a) misuse of digital platforms (b) tampering with system settings or (c) unauthorized alteration or resubmission of answer files	
9	Repeated instances of malpractice listed in S.No. 1 to 8	Cancel the registration of the concerned subject for that semester
10	Case of Impersonation	Cancel the registration of all the subjects registered in the semester and debar both the students for one year. Outside impersonators, to be handed over to the police.

Note: If any other type of malpractice is reported, the enquiry committee may recommend appropriate disciplinary action based on the seriousness of the issue.
